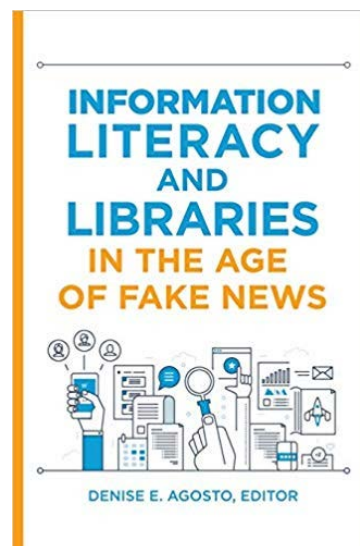


Information Literacy and Libraries in the Age of Fake News
